Home Repair Blitz (Targeted Neighborhoods)

Through a partnership with Habitat for Humanity Peninsula Greater Williamsburg, Hampton Redevelopment & Housing Authority, the City of Hampton enlists the help of hundreds of volunteers to assist elderly, disabled, and low income homeowners with repairs to the exterior of their homes. This program is offered in two targeted neighborhoods a year.

Hampton Housing Venture (Targeted Neighborhoods)

The Hampton Housing Venture focuses housing revitalization in targeted neighborhoods. Existing homeowners and potential homebuyers in the Housing Venture neighborhoods may qualify for income-based and non-income based incentives towards home rehabilitation and home ownership.

Curb Appeal Matching Grants (Targeted Neighborhoods)

The Curb Appeal Matching Grant program assists property owners with exterior improvements to their homes within Hampton Housing Venture and Housing Reinvestment areas. Homeowners are required to match the grant funds that the city invests in the project and the project must be completed within 6 months.
