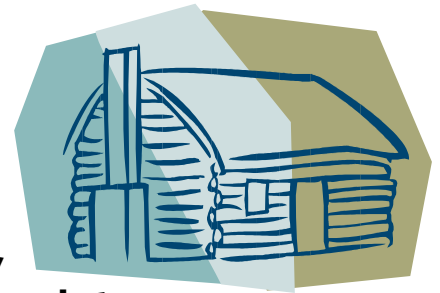


Yearly Diabetes Camps

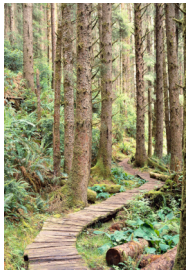
Lions Diabetes Family Camp

This camp is for young people with diabetes, who are between the ages of 6 and 18 years and their families (including parents, siblings and/or grandparents). One adult from each family must attend with child. This camp is each spring (usually late April or early May). It is an action packed weekend at the Triple R Ranch in Chesapeake, Virginia. Camp Jordan

Camp Jordan is hosted by Makemie Woods in Barhamsville VA (near Williamsburg VA) Camp Jordan has a camp for new campers called the Beginner Explorers for campers entering grades 3 -5. This two-night, 3-day session is a quick introduction to camp. Campers entering grades 4 – 10 will have a 9 – 10 day session. Physicians and Diabetes Educators will provide medical supervision. Many of the medical, nursing, and nutritional personnel are volunteers from the supporting hospitals and private practices. Some of the activities included in Camp Jordan are campfires, swimming, boating, crafts, hiking, nature study, and a overnight river canoe trip (weather permitting). All diabetes supplies are furnished for each camper. This camp is in July of each year. Scholarships are available.
